

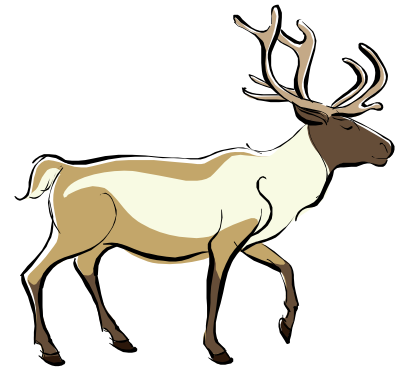

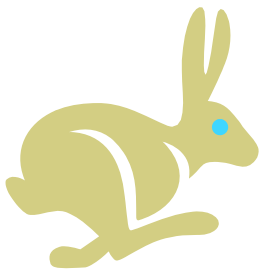
Learn how to read animal tracks and signs!
